

'n February, we are observing Nirvana Day. This is the day that we recognize the passing of the historical Buddha. It's called Nirvana Day because after his physical form was gone, he reached the ultimate level of extinguishing; that he was no longer reborn to suffer any longer. This is different from when he was enlightened in that although he was aware of the true reality of the world, he was still tied to suffering through the existence of his body.

It is important for us all to remember the death of the Buddha for various reasons. One of them is to remind us of our own impermanence and that the Buddha, as great as he was, also was subject to impermanence and so even more so should we be aware of it. Knowing that we are not promised to live forever will inform the decisions we make throughout our lives.

The story of the passing of the Buddha and his last words are also vital for us to remember. He said, "Now, then, monks, I exhort you: All fabrications are subject to decay. Bring about completion by not allowing mindfulness to lapse." This first sentence is in reference to sankhāra, which is a term the Buddha used when talking about the intentional things we do both mentally and physically that shape our reality. Fabricating as an action is neutral, but if we fabricate from ignorance, it will lead to suffering and if we fabricate from wisdom, it will lead out of suffering. Recognizing the difference between the path and goal is necessary, though, and is what the Buddha is pointing out.





Yogācāra, often translated as Consciousness Only (J:唯識Yuishiki), is one of the main streams of Mahayāna Buddhism along with Mādyamika (Middle Way). Since one of my teachers preferred the translation Representation Only rather than Consciousness Only, I will use the translation Representation Only in this series.

Representation Only often is referred to as Buddhist Psychology because its uniqueness is to understand how our mind works from Buddhist perspective. The Thirty Verses on Representation Only written by Bodhisattva Vasubandhu (around 400–480) is one of the best texts to study the understanding of Representation Only and I hope we are able to deepen the understanding of Mahayana Buddhism together through this course.


