
# Resident Minister Rev. Matt Hamasaki



s we are now into spring and getting into summer, there is a lot more pollen in the air. And it doesn't help that there have been such powerful winds blowing it all around! It seems like everyone's allergies are acting up more than usual. Aside from the sneezing, symptoms that are super annoying are the irritation to our eyes that make them itchy, red, and dry. Especially if the wind keeps whipping things into them!

When we are unable to see as clearly and easily as before, we realize how much we rely on our eyes. They help us to interact with the world around us, from helping us get to where we're going to enjoying watching movies to reading the facial expressions on the people we're talking to. And while it's important for us to cultivate awareness of our surroundings so we don't, for instance, run into walls, it's equally important to train our inner eyes.

What this means is we can see beyond material things. We can see the truth behind the physical world. Although the objects and living beings in front of our face are clear with our outer eyes, their reality is obscured to our inner eyes. We cannot see what causes our distress, anxiety, and pain — the chain of events that follows our desires and attachments which makes us unhappy. Only when we can see how rooted our suffering is in our selfish nature as clearly as we can see how a tree is rooted to the ground will we begin to alleviate our distress.



**2023** (In-Person) Bazaar: Saturday, August 12, Noon to 8 p.m. I am pleased to announce the return of our Annual Japanese Food and Cultural Bazaar! Our Bazaar Steering Committee has been meeting for months and has had to make some difficult decisions about our first bazaar since 2019.

After much consideration, it has been decided that for this first year back, we will hold a ONE-DAY bazaar on Saturday, August 12, 2023 from noon to 8 p.m. The primary reason for reducing this year's bazaar to a one-day event is the uncertainty of the number of volunteers we will have to run such a large event. On a normal bazaar weekend, we have had more than 1,000 volunteers PER DAY.

The 2023 bazaar will be somewhat reduced in size and offerings. The committee is still finalizing all the details, but we really need volunteers to help set up the bazaar in the weeks leading up to the event, work at the bazaar on August 12, and help clean up on Sunday, August 13.

The income we typically receive from the bazaar is a major source of our total operating budget, and unfortunately with only a one-day bazaar this year, we will not be able to raise enough funds to meet our budgetary needs.

We are trying to make our one-day event as successful as it can be, but we need the help of many volunteers. Please consider volunteering for one or more shifts. More information will follow in upcoming Sangha newsletters and email announcements.

# Special Announcement

If you haven't already heard, Reverends Bob and Patti Oshita have written a book, **Dharma Is Everywhere** — **Reflections Shared at the California Assembly**. Reverend Bob and Reverend Patti served as the first Buddhist chaplains and the first husband-and-wife team to serve as chaplains for the California State Assembly.

They began serving as chaplains in 2016, just after retiring as ministers of the Sacramento Betsuin. As chaplains, they opened the State Assembly floor sessions by sharing reflections and ended each reflection with the words, "Namo Amida Butsu... with kindness and gratitude beyond words."

The book, which includes a compilation of reflections for each of the State Assembly sessions from June 20, 2016 through August 31, 2020, provides easy-to-read, yet meaningful messages for all who are fortunate enough to read them.



One of the words that came up on my Duolingo Japanese lesson was *wagamama*, which was translated as "selfishness." It reminded me of other Japanese words, *sonomama* and *konomama*, which are translated as "as it is" and "just as I am." I do not have a clear understanding of *sonomama* and *konomama*, so will relay a story about my *wagamama* and my mom.

Before the pandemic, when it was customary to work in the office, I would check on my mom in the afternoon by calling her on her landline. Back in the day, if you did not properly place the receiver in its cradle, if you forgot to press the off button after you used the phone, or if the phone's battery died, the caller would get a busy signal. One afternoon, I called my mom and got a busy signal. I tried again 20 minutes later. It was still busy. I tried again. Still busy. After an hour, I really started to worry. All these horrible thoughts went through my mind, "Is she alright?" "Did she drop the phone trying to call 911?" "Is she lying unconscious on the floor?"

I was going to leave the office to check on her when I tried calling her one last time. She answered. I should have been relieved, but instead I was angry: "Why was the phone busy?!"

The Mom: "Oh, I was on the phone with Martha. We had a nice talk."

Me: "For over an hour!"

The Mom: "We had a lot to talk about."

It went on this way for another minute or two. She apologized, but she did not sound sorry. She was so happy after talking to her friend that all my angry jabs to burst her bubble did not work. Eventually I calmed down.

I forgot to mention that one of the reasons the phone could be busy was if someone was using it to talk to someone. Instead of reaching the most logical explanation, my mind jumped to the worst conclusions and imagined things that were not real. I caused my own worry and stress.

I would like to get to the point of being so full of peace that someone's bad mood or rudeness won't knock me off balance. The dharma helps us gain the wisdom that makes us feel capable and resourceful so that we are not influenced so much by what happens around us or fear of what we cannot control. Relying on Amida in times of turmoil and doubt can help us remain centered and feel like we can deal with whatever happens in life. I hope you will consider applying for LEF funds to further your understanding of the dharma and to share the dharma with others.







- Eitaikyo: Renovation and general maintenance of the temple shrine.


