Happy New Year and welcome to the year 2011. The pace of living now seems to be going faster and becoming more complicated than it has ever been. The technological advances being made in this digital/cyber age are both amazing and overwhelming.

I recently saw a video by Sony that said, "Six of the top 10 in demand jobs in 2010 did not exist in 2004. (Which means): We are currently preparing our students for jobs that don't exist yet. Jobs that will be using technology that has not yet been invented; to solve problems we don't know are problems yet."

At first I found this information almost mind boggling. Yet if we think about it, the future has always been filled with unknowns and uncertainties. When we consider the courage of the Issei to leave their homeland in search of a better life... or the determination and sacrifices of our Nisei to rebuild their lives, re-establish their homes and our communities after the War, they faced a future filled with greater unknowns and uncertainties than we who inherit their legacy could ever imagine. How were they able to do this?

In November, the Sacramento Betsuin celebrated our first-ever Nisei Appreciation Day. It was a wonderful and long-overdue event. Our keynote speaker was Jeff Adachi, the public defender of San Francisco and the son of our own Sam and Gladys Adachi.

Prior to speaking, Jeff asked me, "What would you say describes our Nisei Generation?" I thought about this and replied, "Perhaps the Japanese expression, *gaman*. *Gaman* is to endure the unendurable with grace and dignity."

Later in the program, when he spoke, I felt his words went deeper into the heart of *gaman*. He touched on the reason our Issei and Nisei were able to endure the unendurable with grace and dignity. He said, they endured "*Kodomo no tame ni*"... "For the sake of the children." It was so true.

My name is Kelvin Mark. I have had the pleasure of serving on your Betsuin Board of Trustees for the past seven years and most recently as your president-elect. Let me express how deeply honored I am to serve as your Board President.

Some of you know me as a physician anesthesiologist, a profession I share in common with my wife, Dr. Cheryl Lieu. One might say that karmic destiny brought Cheryl and me together, here to Sacramento, and on to the Buddhist Church of Sacramento. Certainly, our journey has been a combination of efforts, view, and a multitude of local involvements, a journey that makes us feel as though we have always been a part of Sacramento and ever a part of our Betsuin traditions. Here, we have felt at home, and we have you, our sangha, to thank for that.

You may recall that this expression literally translates to "I am fine, because I live in the shade of many people." Though faces and names have changed, the core values of our pioneer legacy have been a constant and now become ours. Such is the nature of our interdependence. Such is the feeling of **okagesama**.

RB has often described ours as the "caring" generation — describing the "shade" we provide in caring for our parents as well as our own children. As this year begins, let us challenge ourselves to think of our generation, at this moment, at this time, in this life, as the "value-added generation." Let us ask what value might we add to the legacy? How shall we leave our Betsuin better than we found it? What "**okage**" or great shade will we dare to cast?

Perhaps three words describe our great shade best: Trust, Commitment and Love: **Trust** as in our aspiration to use common sense and above all else, to do the right thing; **Commitment**, as in the aspiration to do our very best; and **Love**, our compassion, to show always, that we care. As we enter 2011, these three words will serve as my guiding principles toward three basic goals:

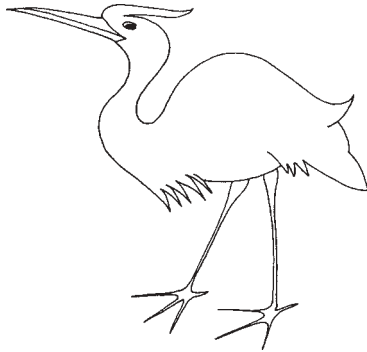
- To foster the transition of capabilities to our next generation of Betsuin leaders.

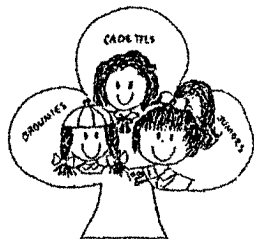

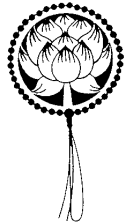

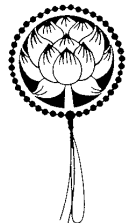
